Bills scheduled for public hearings: use portal for House or Senate depending on body is conducting hearing. If a bill has had its public hearing but not a vote, email the whole committee. If the committee has voted, email the full body if it is scheduled for a floor vote.

Pay attention to whether it was ITL (inexpedient to legislate) or OTP (ought to pass) as you will be voting on the committee recommendation.
